What is certification and why is it important?

Certification is a formal process which validates, based on predetermined standards, an individual's qualifications and knowledge to practice in a defined area. The NAFC certification programs are designed to establish the body of knowledge, experience and education that promotes effective delivery of counseling, evaluation, examination, supervision and forensic services to clients, attorneys and the civil/criminal justice system.

Certification creates an identifiable workforce from which the criminal justice system can refer and offers the opportunity to gain recognition from other professionals, court systems, probation/parole departments, corrections, law enforcement and the public for your achievement as a knowledgeable, competent professional in the field of forensic counseling, evaluation, supervision, etc.

Certification can mean a broader range of job opportunities, provide job mobility, and marketability of your skills. Many companies, agencies, courts, etc., may even pay for your certification, training, and renewal fees.

Apply for Certification through Test-exempt Grandfathering for a Limited Time Period. If you apply during the Grandfathering period, you will not be required to sit for the certification examination.

Unless specifically noted under descriptions, addictions is any addictions as defined by the DSM-V, i.e., substance, behavioral, impulse disorders, etc.

Master Addictions Counselor (MAC)

Clinical level certification. For mental/behavioral health and/or addictions professionals who work in addictions. Full requirements listed below under Clinical level.

Master Social Work Addictions Counselor (MSWAC)

Clinical level certification. For mental/behavioral health and/or addictions professionals who hold an MSW or DSW degree and work with adult and/or juvenile criminal offenders in addictions. Full requirements listed below under Clinical level.

Doctoral Addictions Counselor (DAC)

Clinical level certification. For mental/behavioral health and/or addictions professionals who hold a Doctoral level degree and work with adult and/or juvenile criminal offenders in addictions. Full requirements listed below under Clinical level.

Certified Chemical Dependency Counselor (CCDC)

Clinical level certification. For mental/behavioral health and/or addictions professionals and work specifically in substance abuse. Full requirements listed below under Clinical level.

Certified Forensic Addictions Specialist (CFAS)

Clinical and non-clinical level certification. For mental/behavioral health and/or addictions professionals who work with adult and/or juvenile criminal offenders in addictions. Full requirements listed below under Non-clinical or Clinical level.

Certified Criminal Justice Addictions Specialist (CCJAS)

Clinical and non-clinical level certification. For mental/behavioral health and/or addictions professionals who work with incarcerated adult and/or juvenile criminal offenders in addictions. Full requirements listed below under Non-clinical or Clinical level.

Requirements for the NON-CLINICAL levels of CFAS, CCJAS through Test-exempt Grandfathering:

- Hold a minimum of a Bachelors degree;
- *State licensed, active and in good standing, in your profession, i.e., psychology, social work, marriage & family therapy, mental health counselor, professional counselor, addictions, etc., UNLESS special exemption applies, i.e., through legislation/regulations, you are a state or federal employee, no licensure exists in your state of practice, etc.;
- No ethical violations, reprimands, or other sanctions against your state license and/or certification;
- Must not have previously held an NAFC certification that has been suspended or revoked;
- *180 hours of formal training applicable to the certification for which you are applying;
- *Minimum of 2 years (or 4000 hrs) of supervised experience applicable to the certification for which you are applying*;
- No misdemeanor or felony arrests for violent or sexual offenses, or any other felony;
- Must complete the certification application in its entirety, to include all requested information.

Requirements for the CLINICAL levels of the MAC, MSWAC, DAC, CCDC through test-exempt Grandfathering:

- Hold a Masters degree or higher;
- State licensed, active and in good standing, in your profession, i.e., psychology, social work, marriage & family therapy, mental health counselor, professional counselor, addictions, etc., UNLESS special exemption applies, i.e., through legislation/regulations, you are a state or federal employee, no licensure exists in your state of practice, etc.;
- No ethical violations, reprimands, or other sanctions against your state license and/or certification;
- Must not have previously held an NAFC certification that has been suspended or revoked;
- 270 hours of formal training applicable to the certification for which you are applying;
- Minimum of 3 years (or 6000 hrs) of supervised experience applicable to the certification for which you are applying;
- No misdemeanor or felony arrests for violent or sexual offenses, or any other felony;
- Must complete the certification application in its entirety, to include all requested information.

* applicants that do not fully meet this requirement may apply for the "In-Service" designation until such time when verifiable proof of meeting all requirements is submitted to the NAFC.

- Annual renewal fee: \$125.00 per certification.

NAFC now has reciprocity with the California Association of DUI Treatment Programs (CADTP) for its addictions certifications. CADTP is one of only two (2) certification boards recognized by the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to register and certify AODA counselors in California.

Professionals in any state who hold any NAFC addictions certification may apply to CADTP to become certified and registered through CADTP to practice AODA counseling in California without having to take the CADTP examination.
